Welcome to PLTW Core Training. We're excited you have decided to become a PLTW Teacher and want to ensure you feel prepared to attend Core Training. One key step to successfully starting your Core Training experience is to arrive prepared with the hardware and software required for your courses. Below you will find the computer hardware requirements, links to necessary software, and a technology preparation checklist designed specifically for this course.

PLTW Core Training Preparation Check List

- Work with your school or district's IT department to acquire the device(s) you need, add the required websites to your allow list, and install the software needed for the course.
- Once you have downloaded the software, be sure to open the software and use it while on your school or district site to be sure that everything is working properly.
- Request administrator rights to your device. While this is not always possible, it's very useful to have if you need help troubleshooting issues during Core Training.
- Complete all software tutorials in the prerequisite materials.

1. Laptop or Chromebook which meets or exceeds the specifications below.
2. External mouse
3. Device capable of taking photos and videos such as a digital camera, smartphone, tablet, or laptop with webcam

Core Training Technology Preparation Dos and Don'ts

- Do give yourself plenty of time before training to acquire the right device(s), whitelist the suggested websites, and install needed software. We suggest handling this a few weeks before training or before your school year ends.
- Do open and test the software before you arrive onsite for training to be sure it is working. At times, participants find that they are unable to open software if they try to open it for the first time while they are off their school or district's network. To prevent this, open the software while on your network and test it.
- Do try to acquire administrative rights to your device. While this is not always possible, it's extremely helpful if there are any issues while you're at training.
- Do complete all prerequisite training, including any software tutorials.
- Do not use a brand-new or unopened device that you've never logged into before.
